
## GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS!

As many know I had prostate surgery, and almost every other person I have spoken to has either had a similar experience or knows, or is close to, someone who has. The message has to be, to all men in their mid-fifties onwards, to make themselves aware of this issue and, if in any doubt, see their GP who will determine a way forward if needed.

After a slow start to the season the fixtures have picked up and are coming at a rapid rate thanks to all the good weather. Three Sunday games and 3 Pratt Cup games have kept players busy and if it was not for playing Oldbury twice, we would have a decent record.

On the Sunday fixtures, we have beaten Venturers, had the match abandoned at Nibley and lost to Oldbury. Notable performances have included a century by James Crighton at Nibley, ably supported by one of our many Georges, Whatley (Whatto) with a 50, a couple of 40s from Josh "Matrix" Whitbread and runs and wickets for the 3 Jenkins brothers plus a not out score in the 40s by their Dad at Oldbury. Jonny Hayward is currently our leading wicket taker and the first into double figures for the season, but Danny Jenkins is closing in fast.

With regard to the Pratt Cup our retention campaign started well against new entrants Wickwar under the captaincy of another George, Eskins. We posted 175 with runs coming from Dan Blackwell, Jay Westwood and George, Bailey this time, all making great contributions. Their chase was plucky but

always just behind the rate as they fell 30 short.

Unfortunately, the same score, 175, was to prove not to be enough at big hitting Oldbury. Not content with smashing it all around the park on the previous Sunday, they did the same on Wednesday and chased down the total with an over to spare. What we didn't know was at the next game we'd get nowhere near 175 and still win.

When your correspondent arrived at Tortworth to see only 102 posted by Hillesley he was a little surprised. However, mainly thanks to Whatto making over 30, this had become an imposing total and the home team finished on 70 for 9 after 20. Impressive bowling figures all round were capped off by Danny Jenkins bowling 3 overs conceding 4 runs and taking 3 wickets. As we stand we are second in the Pratt Cup table.

One item that I did just want to note in this article was about the quality of catches taken by Hillesley fielders in each cup game. In particular Jay's against Wickwar and again at Oldbury although that was overtaken by skipper Eskins spectacular leap and hold and finally George Bailey at Tortworth. As long as nobody recall Whatto's caught and bowled howler in the same game, in years to come we will have some

fond memories of these warm summer evenings.




